

## Designation students

Students who enroll in ICCIE's designation program pay one all-inclusive fee of \$4,000 which covers

- tuition for the five core courses and two electives (including materials);
- registration in three ICCIE or VCIA teleconferences;
- all testing fees (unless the student elects to delay testing related to a module)
- access to our on-line courses and software.

Half of the program fee (\$2,000) is due upon enrollment, with the second half due one year later.

## Modular students

## PROGRAM & POLICY GUIDELINES

Born in the summer of 2004, the International Center for Captive Insurance Education (ICCIE — pronounced “I see”) is the first and only comprehensive captive insurance education program in North America.

The courses offered through ICCIE are relevant to any domicile around the world, and a faculty of first-rate instructors means that the ACI (Associate in Captive Insurance) designation received from ICCIE will be recognized and respected around the world.

## What it is and how it came to be:

Several years in the making, ICCIE was developed in response to a need expressed by captive insurance professionals for in-depth educational offerings, information on current topics, and a professional designation. Despite a strong pattern of expansion in captive insurance companies, research showed that there was a critical lack of education and training in the industry that, if not corrected, could affect its continued growth and professionalism.

*ICCIE's mission is to assist in building the capacity of the captive insurance industry through comprehensive captive insurance education of industry professionals.*

## Where, when, and how ICCIE courses are taught:

The core courses developed for ICCIE can be taken in a traditional face-to-face setting or on-line via instructor-led asynchronous learning. Each course is offered in face-to-face format one or two times during the year (just prior to or following a major conference, and in the same geographic location). The on-line versions of these courses are also offered one or two times per year (in staggered months), and include a start and end date, followed by a testing period. Each on-line course is instructor-led, but students are able to do the work for each one or two-week section on their own time.

ICCIE's designation students take two electives from the American Institute of Chartered Property Casualty Underwriters (AICPCU) and/or the Insurance Education Association (IEA). These electives are taught via instructor-led scheduled on-line classes or via independent study (completely self-paced).

## Programs of study:

ICCIE offers students the opportunity to participate in its captive insurance education program as either designation candidates or individual class (modular) students.

Designation students complete ICCIE's comprehensive captive insurance education program – including its own proprietary curriculum and testing — and earn the ACI professional designation that will be acknowledged as the standard in the industry.

Modular students participate in ICCIE classes on a course-by-course basis. These may be students who are not risk managers or captive professionals, but are in a related field and want to learn more about a particular area of the captive insurance business. Alternatively, modular students may be those who have extensive experience in captive insurance but want to focus on individual courses of particular interest.

## Other features of the ACI designation program:

Along with ICCIE's core courses and electives from affiliated organizations, designation candidates participate in "hot topic" teleconferences, which ensures that they are up-to-date on the most current issues in captive insurance.

Each designation student is guided by a mentor — so each participant in the program matriculates with the aid of an experienced advisor.

ACI candidates have the option of substituting a work project for one of their electives, giving them

the opportunity to apply their knowledge to real-life situations.

## Who teaches ICCIE courses?

## Program costs & guidelines

### Enrollment process: Student Applications

To maintain the high quality of the program and to ensure a class experience in an optimum learning environment, ICCIE encourages student applications only from individuals with some experience in the captive or risk management industries (or a related industry) or with a similar educational background. To apply to the designation program or for an individual course, students complete and submit an ICCIE application form, which can be accessed at [www.iccie.org](http://www.iccie.org) or sent out via mail or fax from the ICCIE office. Applicants will receive a response from ICCIE within five business days of submitting an application.

Once ICCIE has advised a student that her application has been accepted, a course or curriculum fee must be paid to reserve a spot in one of the courses.
